	5:30pm September	<p>Labor Day Activity Menu</p> <p>Read the books to the class that have career options that appeal to them and discuss the career opportunities available to kids in their generation.</p> <p>Thank a Community Helper: Write thank you cards to some of your community helpers—police officers, firefighters or paramedics—and then send them to the station.</p> <p>A Day in the Life: Use a video camera to record your students talking about a day in their lives, and then contrast it by talking about the lives of students living abroad in places that have unfair labor laws.</p> <p>Child Labor: Use non-fiction books and articles to give your students a first-hand look at how child labor is still utilized around the world.</p> <p>Make Career Flags: Cover construction paper with pictures from various careers—and hang them around your classroom.</p> <p>Famous Person with Pizzazz: Have each of your students research and then create a PowerPoint or Prezi presentation about a person who influenced the work environment in our country.</p> <p>Occupations Collage: Have your kids make a collage about all of occupations and hang the collages around the classroom.</p>					
5:30pm October	<p>Breast Cancer Awareness Content & Activities <i>Wear a pink ribbon on Wednesdays in October</i></p> <p>Host a pink fashion show – Invite friends and family to a fashion show run by club members hitting the “runway” in all pink clothing.</p> <p>Hold a pink pumpkin contest – Combine Halloween activities into your awareness efforts by having students create and showcase their best breast cancer awareness pumpkin. Display pumpkins in the lobby with collection jars next to each one. The pumpkin with the most jar donations wins and you can donate the funds to a cause like Susan G. Komen or a local cancer center for women.</p> <p>Breast cancer awareness bulletin board – Decorate a bulletin board in a highly-trafficked area. Encourage your staff to use their talents for raising awareness. Keep it simple with facts or create a themed board to draw more attention.</p> <p>“Live and Learn” with a breast cancer survivor – Ask a breast cancer survivor to come and speak to the children. Students will appreciate hearing a firsthand account of why prevention measures are so important.</p>
